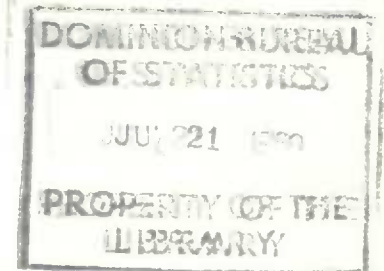

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

March, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of March, 11,754,498 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This represents an increase of 3.6 per cent over the total of 11,343,537 tons reported for the same month of 1959. Of the March 1960 total, 9,308,454 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as compared with 8,982,795 tons in March 1959. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 928,775 tons as against 1,019,624, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,517,269 tons in contrast to 1,341,118 a year earlier.

A breakdown of freight, by the six commodity groups, shows the following tonnages loaded at points in Canada: products of agriculture, 1,552,971 tons (as against 1,579,265 in 1959); animals and products, 81,417 tons (78,249); products of mines, 3,042,592 tons (2,962,186); products of forests, 1,296,177 tons (1,141,192); and manufacturers and miscellaneous, 3,239,078 tons (3,128,204). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) rose to 96,219 tons from 93,699.

A provincial breakdown of the total freight loaded in Canada shows increases ranging downward from 22.4 per cent to 0.1 per cent in eight of the ten provinces, namely: Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Quebec, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. Loadings in Prince Edward Island and Ontario declined 9.5 per cent and 1.3 per cent respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month totalled 11,755,125 tons of which 8,581,326 were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers), and 3,173,799 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 11,319,870 tons terminated in 1959, comprising 8,580,282 tons unloaded in Canada and 2,739,588 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first quarter of 1960, a total of 33,766,157 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as compared with 32,947,234 tons in the corresponding quarter of 1959.
