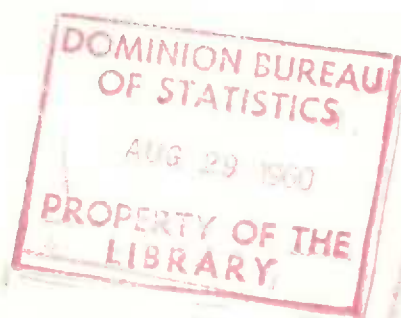

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

April, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the Canadian National Railways, Canadian Pacific Railway Company and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually).

During the month of April 11,335,435 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, down 4.7 per cent from 11,896,705 in the corresponding 1959 period. Of the current month total, 9,236,025 (9,645,928 in 1959) were domestic loadings, including water imports, and 822,763 tons (949,498) were receipts from United States connections destined to Canadian points. Intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,276,647 tons in contrast to 1,301,279 a year earlier.

A breakdown, by commodity groups, of the 9,236,025 tons of railway freight loaded in Canada during April, 1960 shows that 1,628,525 or 17.6 per cent were products of agriculture (1,622,352 or 16.8 per cent in 1959); 76,543 tons or 0.8 per cent were animals and products (86,090 or 0.9 per cent); 3,469,374 tons or 37.6 per cent were products of mines (3,638,645 or 37.7 per cent); 859,826 tons or 9.3 per cent were forest products (909,386 or 9.4 per cent); 3,105,306 tons or 33.6 per cent were manufactures and miscellaneous (3,250,502 or 33.7 per cent); and 96,451 tons or 1.1 per cent were less than carload freight (138,953 or 1.5 per cent).

On a provincial basis, loadings decreased in all but three provinces during the period under review. In Nova Scotia 21.4 per cent less tonnage was handled, while in Prince Edward Island, Alberta, Ontario, New Brunswick and British Columbia the volume declined 17.8, 11.1, 10.5, 5.3 and 1.7 per cent respectively. Increases were shown in Quebec, (12.5 per cent); Saskatchewan, (8.9 per cent); and Manitoba, (1.8 per cent).

During the month, 11,405,908 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada, 8,728,630 tons of which were unloaded at points in the Dominion (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,677,278 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 11,921,873 tons terminated in April 1959, comprising 9,197,653 tons at Canadian points and 2,724,220 to United States connections.
