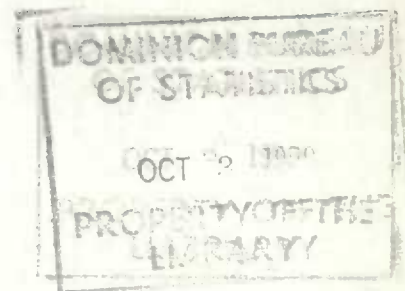

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

May, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of May, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 14,448,693 tons, an increase of 5.7 per cent from 13,672,142 tons in May 1959. Of the May 1960 total, 12,392,380 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 11,593,005 tons in 1959. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 886,591 tons as compared with 926,257 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,169,722 tons as against 1,152,880 in 1959.

In the month under review, products of agriculture loaded in Canada totalled 2,324,378 tons, up 13.1 per cent from 2,054,632 tons a year earlier. Wheat was mainly responsible for the increase with 1,639,038 tons being handled in 1960 as against 1,274,076 tons in the previous year. Products of mines movements increased in 1960 to 5,673,797 tons from 5,231,445 with iron ore being the main commodity carried in both periods. Products of forests rose to 940,890 tons from 898,342. Manufactures and miscellaneous products increased slightly to 3,278,897 tons from 3,224,291, while animals and products declined to 75,295 tons from 81,106. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped to 99,123 tons from 103,189 in 1959.

A provincial breakdown of the total freight loaded in Canada showed increases in Newfoundland, (60.8 per cent); Quebec, (16.1 per cent); Saskatchewan, (14.9 per cent); Manitoba, (14.0 per cent); British Columbia, (11.7 per cent); New Brunswick, (4.8 per cent); and Alberta, (0.1 per cent). Prince Edward Island registered the largest decline, with traffic dropping 12.8 per cent. In Nova Scotia and Ontario the volume was down 3.7 and 1.4 per cent, respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month totalled 14,474,295 tons, of which 12,137,406 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water-carriers), and 2,336,889 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison 13,664,190 tons terminated in May 1959, comprising 11,296,597 tons unloaded in Canada and 2,367,593 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first five months of 1960, a total of 59,550,285 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States, up 1.8 per cent from 58,516,081 tons in the corresponding period of 1959.
