RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

June, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of June, 15,275,338 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This represents a decrease of 0.8 per cent from 15,407,759 tons in the same month of 1959. Of the June 1960 total, 13,281,211 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in comparison with 13,366,434 tons in June 1959; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 802,611 tons as against 879,620; and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,191,516 tons in contrast to 1,161,705 a year earlier.

Products of forests loaded by railways in Canada during June totalled 1,170,266 tons, down 12.2 per cent from 1,332,568 tons a year earlier. Movements of animals and products decreased in 1960 to 76,227 from 79,867 and manufactures and miscellaneous dropped in volume to 3,051,142 tons from 3,147,500. Products of mines increased to 6,805,400 tons from 6,637,687 with iron ore contributing 2,927,467 tons in the current year in contrast to 2,723,446 tons, previously. Products of agriculture rose slightly to 2,085,403 tons from 2,064,404 while less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined to 92,773 tons from 104,408.

During the month of June, 15,209,587 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada. Of this total, 12,693,488 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,516,099 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 15,568,318 tons terminated in June 1959 of which 13,128,503 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,439,815 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first six months of 1960, a total of 74,825,623 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections as compared with 73,923,840 tons in the corresponding six months of 1959.
