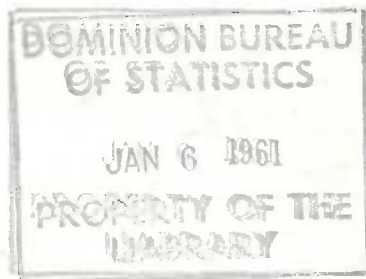

THE HISTORY OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

July, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of July, 14,652,030 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections. This represents a decrease of 9.5 per cent from 16,187,976 tons in the same month of 1959. Of the July 1960 total, 12,806,403 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in comparison with 14,136,647 tons in July 1959; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 739,820 tons as against 862,793; and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,105,807 tons in contrast to 1,188,536 a year earlier.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during July totalled 7,161,352 tons, down 2.9 per cent from 7,376,100 tons a year earlier. Manufactures and miscellaneous decreased in volume to 2,805,974 tons from 3,161,971; products of agriculture fell to 1,595,101 tons from 2,125,968; products of forests dropped to 1,089,961 tons from 1,265,976 and animals and products declined to 71,315 tons from 80,824; less than carload freight (l.c.l.) decreased to 82,700 tons from 125,808.

A provincial breakdown of total freight loaded in Canada showed decreases in eight of the ten provinces. Prince Edward Island registered the largest decline, with traffic dropping (45.4 per cent); Nova Scotia, (33.2 per cent); Manitoba, (31.7 per cent); Saskatchewan, (20.5 per cent); New Brunswick, (15.9 per cent); Ontario, (9.5 per cent); Alberta, (5.2 per cent); and Newfoundland (0.3 per cent). British Columbia and Quebec loadings rose 3.0 per cent and 1.2 per cent respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month totalled 14,615,572 tons, of which 12,386,484 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water-carriers) and 2,229,088 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 16,232,443 tons terminated in July 1959 of which 13,748,954 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,483,489 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first seven months of 1960, a total of 89,475,823 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections as compared with 90,111,816 tons in the corresponding seven months of 1959.
