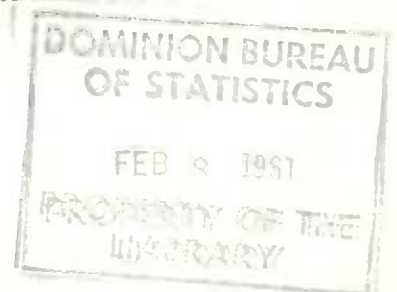

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

August, 1960

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During August, 15,196,620 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 0.9 per cent from 15,329,973 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the August 1960 total, 13,304,499 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 13,477,849 a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 743,586 tons in contrast to 774,591 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,148,535 tons versus 1,077,533 a year earlier.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 7,156,654 tons, down 0.8 per cent from 7,217,767 tons in August 1959. Manufacturers and miscellaneous decreased in volume to 2,939,512 tons from 2,984,331; products of agriculture declined to 1,864,687 tons from 2,028,771; animals and products fell to 75,389 tons from 81,481; and less than carload freight (l.c.l.) decreased to 88,015 tons from 107,571. Products of forests was the only commodity group carried in greater volume during the period, rising to 1,180,242 tons as against 1,057,928 in August 1959.

On a provincial basis, decreases occurred in five provinces during the current month. Manitoba reported 17.5 per cent less tonnage; Nova Scotia 16.9 per cent; Saskatchewan 13.3 per cent, while Quebec and Ontario decreases amounted to 4.4 and 0.7 per cent respectively. Increases were reported by British Columbia (30.5 per cent); Alberta (27.6 per cent); Prince Edward Island (21.8 per cent); Newfoundland (16.1 per cent) and New Brunswick (4.4 per cent).

During August, 15,279,228 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada compared with 15,290,976 tons in August 1959. Of the 1960 total, 12,961,749 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) as opposed to 13,046,458 tons the previous year, and 2,317,479 tons were delivered to United States rail connections in August 1960, as against 2,244,518 tons for the same 1959 month.
