RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JANUARY, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of the following twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually):

During January, 9,999,739 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 4.6 per cent from the 10,481,264 tons reported a year earlier. Of the January 1961 total, 8,137,486 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in comparison with 8,454,231 tons for the same month last year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada decreased to 739,595 tons from 765,312, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) declined to 1,122,658 tons from 1,261,721 in January 1960.

Animals and products loaded by railways in Canada during January totalled 69,348 tons, down 8.0 per cent from 75,354 tons a year earlier. Manufactures and miscellaneous decreased 5.2 per cent to 2,685,737 tons from 2,832,700; products of mines declined 5.0 per cent to 2,788,071 tons from 2,933,528; products of forests fell 2.9 per cent to 1,108,592 tons from 1,141,461; and products of agriculture decreased 0.5 per cent to 1,384,464 tons from 1,391,459. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) increased in volume to 101,274 tons from 79,729, a gain of 27.0 per cent.

On a provincial basis, decreases occurred in five provinces during January 1961. Nova Scotia reported 28.3 per cent less tonnage; Prince Edward Island 20.0 per cent; British Columbia 10.3 per cent; New Brunswick 8.2 per cent and Ontario 4.1 per cent. Increases were reported in Newfoundland (30.5 per cent); Manitoba (11.1 per cent); Saskatchewan (4.7 per cent); Quebec (4.0 per cent) and Alberta (1.1 per cent).

During the month under review, 10,113,349 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada compared with 10,459,224 tons in January 1960. Of the 1961 figure, 7,823,900 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,289,449 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compared with 7,900,349 tons unloaded in Canada and 2,558,875 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year ago.
