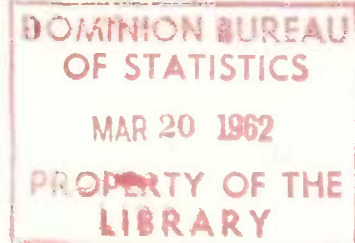

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During October 1961, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections rose to 16,264,837 tons, an increase of 11.1 per cent from 14,636,126 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the October 1961 total, 14,387,970 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 12,657,553 tons a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell to 826,930 tons from 855,262, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 1,049,937 tons from 1,123,311.

Products of mines loaded in Canada during the month under review totalled 7,463,134 tons, up 23.4 per cent from the 6,046,052 tons reported in October 1960. Animals and products increased 12.4 per cent to 100,568 tons from 89,489; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 9.5 per cent to 3,301,083 tons from 3,015,530 and products of agriculture were up 2.2 per cent to 2,389,777 tons from 2,338,667. Products of forests declined 3.7 per cent to 1,037,311 tons from 1,077,098, while less than carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 5.9 per cent to 96,097 tons from 90,717.

On a geographic basis, increases in traffic occurred in eight of the ten provinces. Tonnage loaded in Nova Scotia was more than doubled that of the previous October; British Columbia increased 10.2 per cent; Saskatchewan 9.8 per cent; Ontario 8.3 per cent; Manitoba 6.4 per cent; Newfoundland 4.9 per cent; Alberta 3.8 per cent and Quebec 2.3 per cent. In Prince Edward Island rail traffic fell off 31.0 per cent and New Brunswick reported 0.9 per cent fewer tons loaded.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 16,335,750 tons, an increase of 10.0 per cent from 14,854,185 tons reported in October 1960. Of the 1961 total, 13,906,000 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,429,750 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compared with 12,505,490 tons terminated in Canada and 2,348,695 tons delivered to United States rail connections in October 1960.

There were 126,828,623 tons of revenue freight loaded in Canada in the January-October period of 1961, as against 134,861,156 tons reported in the like period of 1960, a decline of 6.0 per cent.
