RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more). Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During November, loadings in Canada and receipts from United States rail connections aggregated 12,460,055 tons, a 5.9 per cent increase over the 11,768,035 tons reported for the same 1960 period. Of the November 1961 total, 10,666,322 tons were loaded in the Dominion (including shipments received from waterlines), up 8.9 per cent from 9,798,709 tons a year previous. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada declined to 825,392 tons from 841,046, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) was down 159,939 tons to 968,341.

November movements were above year-earlier levels for four of the six major commodity groups. Loadings of agricultural products rose 19.2 per cent to 2,309,254 tons from 1,937,751, due to heavier shipments of wheat and mine products with increased volumes of iron ore and gypsum were up 11.2 per cent to 4,198,243 tons from 3,776,008. Animal products recorded a gain of 7.2 per cent to 103,519 tons from 96,593 and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 4.3 per cent to 3,029,869 tons from 2,905,838. Forest products tended to be lower than a year earlier, declining 4.5 per cent to 944,933 tons from 989,186 and less than carload freight (l.c.l.) was off 13.7 per cent to 80,504 tons from 93,333.

Comparisons with November 1960, on a geographic basis, shows increases in rail freight loadings in all provinces except Newfoundland and New Brunswick. Ton-nages rose 23.0 per cent in Alberta; 17.6 per cent in Nova Scotia; 14.9 per cent in British Columbia; 10.4 per cent in Saskatchewan; 5.7 per cent in Quebec; 4.8 per cent in Ontario; 3.9 per cent in Manitoba; and 3.1 per cent in Prince Edward Island. Decreases in Newfoundland and New Brunswick amounted to 2.3 and 7.4 per cent respectively.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review increased 4.2 per cent to 12,519,252 tons from 12,019,214 a year earlier. Of the November 1961 total, 10,340,950 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including shipments delivered to waterlines), and 2,178,302 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 9,763,163 tons terminated and 2,256,051 tons delivered to the United States in November 1960.

During the period January-November 1961, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail totalled 139,288,678 tons, down 5.0 per cent from 146,629,191 tons carried in the comparable eleven months of 1960.
