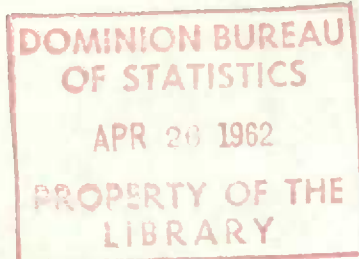

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER, 1961

Presented herein are revenue freight commodity statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During the month of December, 10,967,528 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a 2.0 per cent increase over the 10,753,866 tons reported for the same month of 1960. Of the December 1961 total, 9,281,372 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) in contrast to 8,931,032 in December 1960. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to Canadian points amounted to 662,050 tons as compared with 623,803. Intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada) declined to 1,024,106 tons from 1,199,031 in the previous year.

A breakdown of freight by the six major commodity groups, shows the following tonnages loaded at points in Canada: products of agriculture, 1,934,131 tons (as against 1,796,837 in 1960); animals and products, 72,467 tons (77,195); products of mines, 3,220,181 tons (3,040,958); products of forests, 1,035,700 tons (1,100,439); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,947,828 tons (2,798,929). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped 39.1 per cent to 71,065 tons from 116,674.

On a provincial basis, loadings increased considerably in Nova Scotia, British Columbia and Saskatchewan where tonnages were up 33.6, 14.9 and 8.5 per cent, respectively. Newfoundland reported the largest decline in rail traffic, dropping 19.0 per cent, while the volume in Alberta dropped 8.5 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 10,993,383 tons of which 8,501,881 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,491,502 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 10,906,541 tons terminated in December 1960, of which 8,384,670 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,521,871 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the year 1961, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 152,114,254 tons, down 3.3 per cent from 157,383,057 tons one year earlier.
