## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

February, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of February, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 9,813,713, a decrease of 14.9 per cent from 11,530,395 tons for the same month in 1960. Of the February, 1961 total, 7,959,566 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) in contrast to 9,307,161 tons loaded in 1960. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 719,308 tons as compared with 845,573, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,134,839 tons as against 1,377,661.

A breakdown of freight, by the six commodity groups, shows the following tonnages loaded at points in Canada: products of Agriculture, 1,320,878 tons (as against 1,690,041 in 1960); Animals and products, 64,037 tons (76,479); products of mines, 2,652,619 tons (2,996,995); products of forests, 1,178,516 tons (1,431,047); and manufactures and miscellaneous, 2,673,269 tons (3,030,647). Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped to 70,247 from 81,952 in 1960.

A geographic breakdown of freight loaded in Canada showed decreases in all of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia registered the largest decline with traffic dropping (36.4 per cent); Prince Edward Island, (23.7 per cent); Saskatchewan, (23.3 per cent); British Columbia, (14.3 per cent); Alberta, (13.3 per cent); New Brunswick, (12.8 per cent); Manitoba, (11.2 per cent); Ontario, (10.4 per cent); Quebec, (8.6 per cent) and Newfoundland, (3.8 per cent) respectively.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month totalled 9,944,347 tons, of which 7,448,913 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water-carriers) and 2,495,434 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 11,555,105 tons terminated in February, 1960 of which 8,714,470 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,840,635 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

For the first two months of 1961, a total of 19,813,452 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as compared with 22,011,659 tons in the corresponding period of 1960.

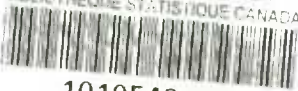
