RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

March, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During March, 10,304,787 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 12.3 per cent from 11,754,498 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the March 1961 total, 8,200,662 tons were loaded at points in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 9,308,454 a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 778,824 tons in contrast to 928,775 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 1,325,301 tons as against 1,517,269 a year ago.

Products of forests loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 1,050,145 tons, down 19.0 per cent from 1,296,177 tons reported in March 1960. Animals and animal products fell 18.4 per cent to 66,426 tons from 81,417; products of mines declined 11.3 per cent to 2,698,615 tons from 3,042,592; manufactures and miscellaneous decreased 10.3 per cent to 2,906,572 tons from 3,239,078; products of agriculture fell 9.4 per cent to 1,407,279 tons from 1,552,971; and less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 25.6 per cent to 71,625 tons from 96,219.

On a provincial basis, decreases occurred in all provinces except Newfoundland. Nova Scotia reported 37.2 per cent less tonnage; New Brunswick 25.2 per cent; Saskatchewan 19.8 per cent; Manitoba 15.1 per cent; Quebec 8.3 per cent; Ontario 7.3 per cent; British Columbia 7.1 per cent; Alberta 4.2 per cent and Prince Edward Island 3.4 per cent. Newfoundland reported an increase of 13.4 per cent.

During March, 10,201,266 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada compared with 11,755,125 tons in March 1960. Of the 1961 total, 7,651,609 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) as opposed to 8,581,326 tons the previous year, and 2,549,657 tons were delivered to United States rail connections as against 3,173,799 tons for the same month in 1960.

For the first quarter of 1961, a total of 30,118,239 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as compared with 33,766,157 tons in the corresponding quarter of 1960.
