RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

April, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During April, 10,923,839 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 3.6 per cent from 11,335,435 tons reported a year earlier. Of the April 1961 total, 8,998,624 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 9,236,025 tons reported for the same month last year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada declined to 749,351 tons from 822,763 while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 1,175,864 tons from 1,276,647 in April 1960.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review, amounted to 3,002,334 tons, down 13.5 per cent from 3,469,631 tons the previous year. Animals and products declined 5.9 per cent to 72,004 tons from 76,543 and manufactures and miscellaneous decreased 3.4 per cent to 2,998,479 tons from 3,105,306. Products of agriculture and products of forests rose 17.9 per cent and 8.3 per cent to 1,919,225 tons from 1,628,268 and 930,148 tons from 859,826 respectively. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 20.8 per cent to 76,434 tons from 96,451.

On a provincial basis, loadings decreased in all the Atlantic provinces, Quebec and Ontario. Prince Edward Island reported 32.1 per cent less tonnage; Nova Scotia 18.7 per cent; Quebec 16.3 per cent; Newfoundland 5.8 per cent; Ontario 1.7 per cent and New Brunswick 1.3 per cent. In the West, Alberta reported 15.7 per cent more tonnage; British Columbia 9.4 per cent; Saskatchewan 9.2 per cent and Manitoba 4.1 per cent.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during April 1961 totalled 11,006,870, a decline of 3.5 per cent from 11,405,908 tons reported the previous year. Of the 1961 total, 8,503,482 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,503,388 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,728,630 tons terminated a year earlier and 2,677,278 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first four months of 1961, a total of 41,042,078 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as compared with 45,101,592 tons for the same period of 1960.
