RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MAY, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During May, 13,333,453 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 7.7 per cent from 14,448,193 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the May 1961 total, 11,504,521 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 12,391,880 tons reported a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada, declined to 794,312 tons from 886,591, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) fell to 1,034,620 tons from 1,169,722 in May 1960.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 4,700,195 tons, down 17.2 per cent from 5,673,797 tons the previous year. Animals and products decreased 4.2 per cent to 72,127 tons from 75,295 and products of forests declined slightly to 935,809 tons from 940,890. Products of agriculture and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 3.3 per cent and 0.7 per cent respectively, to 2,402,080 tons from 2,324,378 and 3,299,979 tons from 3,278,397. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 4.8 per cent to 94,331 tons from 99,123.

A provincial breakdown of revenue freight loaded in Canada during May, 1961 showed decreases in five of the ten provinces. Quebec and Ontario each reported 14.7 per cent less tonnage; New Brunswick 2.2 per cent; Manitoba 1.7 per cent and Newfoundland 1.1 per cent. Prince Edward Island reported 50.4 per cent more tonnage during the same period; Saskatchewan rose 8.1 per cent; British Columbia 2.0 per cent; Alberta 1.5 per cent and Nova Scotia 0.8 per cent.

In the month under review, 13,375,700 tons of revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada, a decrease of 7.6 per cent from the 14,473,795 tons reported for May 1960. Of the 1961 total, 11,096,445 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,279,255 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,136,906 tons terminated a year earlier and 2,336,889 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first five months of 1961, a total of 54,375,531 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from the United States as against 59,549,785 tons for the same period of 1960.
