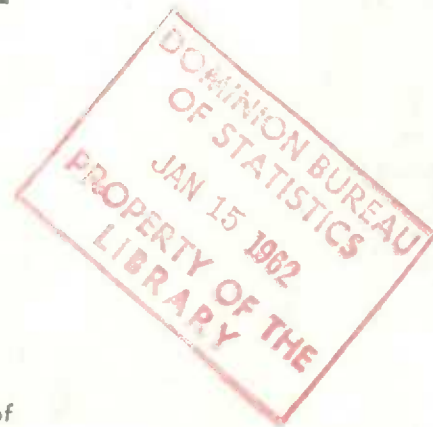

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During July, 13,742,254 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 6.2 per cent from 14,652,030 tons reported a year earlier. Of the July 1961 total, 12,151,410 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 12,806,403 tons reported a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell to 721,679 tons from 739,820, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 869,165 tons from 1,105,807.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 5,716,859 tons, down 20.2 per cent from 7,161,352 tons reported in July 1960. Products of agriculture showed an increase of 43.6 per cent to 2,290,380 tons from 1,595,101; products of forests, were up 6.6 per cent to 1,161,556 tons from 1,089,961; animals and products rose 3.9 per cent to 74,128 tons from 71,315; and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 0.6 per cent to 2,821,827 tons from 2,805,974. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) showed an increase of 4.8 per cent to 86,660 tons in the 1961 month compared with 82,700 a year earlier.

On a provincial basis, decreases in traffic volume occurred in five of the ten provinces during the month under review. Quebec reported 22.6 less tonnage; Newfoundland 10.1 per cent; Ontario 5.4 per cent; Nova Scotia 3.0 per cent and Alberta 1.2 per cent. Loadings increased 76.5 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 52.5 per cent in Saskatchewan; 9.7 per cent in British Columbia; 8.2 per cent in New Brunswick; and 1.2 per cent in Manitoba.

During July 1961 freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 13,734,384 tons, a decrease of 6.0 per cent from 14,615,572 reported for the same month last year. Of the 1961 total, 11,697,515 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,036,869 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,386,484 tons terminated in July, 1960 and 2,229,088 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first seven months of 1961, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections amounted to 82,472,986 tons as against 89,475,823 tons reported during the same period of 1960.
