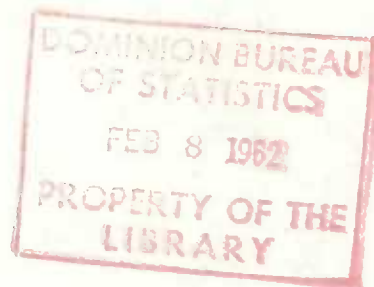

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

AUGUST, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During the month of August, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 14,374,479 tons, down 5.4 per cent from the 15,196,620 tons reported for August 1960. Of the August 1961 total, 12,627,240 tons were loaded on lines in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 13,304,499 tons reported for the same month a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose to 816,493 tons from 743,586, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) amounted to 930,746 tons as against 1,148,535 reported for August 1960.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review totalled 6,007,258 tons, a decrease of 16.1 per cent from the 7,156,654 tons reported in August 1960. Products of forests increased 9.5 per cent to 1,292,424 tons from 1,180,242; agricultural products rose 7.9 per cent to 2,011,410 tons from 1,864,687; animals and products were up 7.6 per cent to 81,109 tons from 75,389 and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 7.4 per cent to 3,156,688 tons from 2,939,512. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 11.1 per cent to 78,351 tons from 88,015.

On a provincial basis, rail movements were down in six of the ten provinces. Manitoba reported 25.8 per cent less tonnage loaded; Quebec 15.9 per cent; Newfoundland 11.0 per cent; Nova Scotia 7.0 per cent; New Brunswick 4.6 per cent and Ontario 0.9 per cent. Prince Edward Island recorded an increase of 21.9 per cent; Alberta gained 14.8 per cent; British Columbia 9.9 per cent and Saskatchewan 4.4 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada during the month under review totalled 14,323,662 tons, of which 12,141,944 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,181,718 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. By comparison, 15,279,228 tons terminated in August 1960, of which 12,961,749 tons were unloaded in Canada and 2,317,479 tons were delivered to rail connections in the United States.

From January 1 to August 31, 96,847,465 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, down 7.5 per cent from 104,672,443 tons for the same period of 1960.
