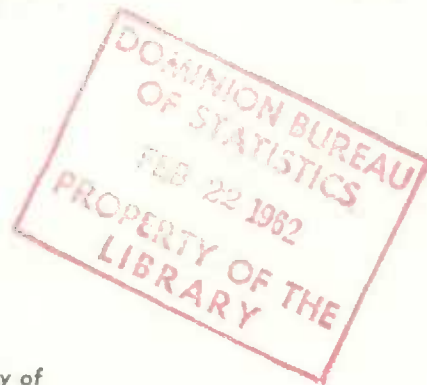

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER, 1961

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having gross annual revenues of \$500,000 or more).

During September 1961, 13,716,321 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a decrease of 11.8 per cent from 15,552,587 tons reported a year earlier. Of the September 1961 total, 12,084,655 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 13,554,102 in the 1960 month. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell to 729,746 tons from 776,631, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 901,920 tons from 1,221,854.

Products of mines loaded by railways in Canada during the month under review amounted to 5,975,904 tons, down 14.5 per cent from 6,989,275 tons reported in September 1960. Products of agriculture declined 11.6 per cent to 1,882,058 tons from 2,128,745; products of forests decreased 9.5 per cent to 1,064,917 tons from 1,176,956 and manufactures and miscellaneous fell 2.8 per cent to 3,001,687 tons from 3,088,483. Animals and products showed an increase of 1.7 per cent to 78,845 tons from 77,561, while less than carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 12.7 per cent to 81,244 tons from 93,082.

On a provincial basis, decreased loadings were reported in all provinces excepting Alberta. Manitoba reported 26.5 per cent less tonnage; New Brunswick 22.1 per cent; Nova Scotia 15.7 per cent; Saskatchewan 13.8 per cent; Quebec 13.5 per cent; Newfoundland 11.5 per cent; Ontario 7.5 per cent; Prince Edward Island 7.1 per cent and British Columbia 3.2 per cent. In Alberta the volume of freight loaded increased 0.5 per cent.

During September 1961, freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 13,637,637 tons, a decrease of 13.3 per cent from 15,727,125 reported for the same month last year. Of the 1961 total, 11,490,549 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers and 2,147,088 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 13,154,718 tons terminated and 2,572,407 tons delivered to United States rail connections in September, 1960.

During the first nine months of 1961, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections amounted to 110,563,786 tons compared with 120,225,030 tons reported for the same period of 1960.
