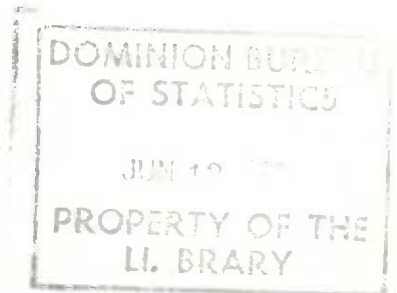

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JANUARY, 1962

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of the following twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,00 or more annually):

Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During the month of January, revenue freight loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, rose 8.8 per cent to 10,877,529 tons from 9,999,739 tons reported for the same month one year earlier. Of the January 1962 total, 8,956,105 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) as against 8,137,486 tons in January 1961. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose to 752,426 tons from 739,595 a year ago, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,168,998 tons from 1,122,658 tons in the previous year.

In the month under review, products of agriculture loaded in Canada rose 14.2 per cent to 1,581,228 tons from 1,384,464 with wheat being the main commodity carried in both years. Animal products increased 13.6 per cent to 78,772 tons from 69,348 and products of mines rose 12.1 per cent to 3,125,068 tons as against 2,788,071 tons in 1961. Manufactures and miscellaneous products recorded a gain of 11.5 per cent to 2,994,540 tons from 2,685,737, while products of forests increased slightly to 1,115,792 tons from 1,108,592. Less than carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped 40.1 per cent to 60,705 tons from 101,274.

On a geographic basis, increases in traffic occurred in eight of the ten provinces. Nova Scotia registered the largest increase in loadings rising, 29.6 per cent; Prince Edward Island 24.0 per cent; British Columbia 22.5 per cent; Alberta 18.5 per cent; Saskatchewan 13.4 per cent; New Brunswick 12.9 per cent; Ontario 7.0 per cent and Newfoundland 1.5 per cent. Decreases in Manitoba and Quebec amounted to 8.8 and 0.2 per cent respectively.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during January 1962, totalled 10,894,103 tons, an increase of 7.7 per cent from 10,113,349 tons one year earlier. Of the 1962 total, 8,310,220 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,583,883 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,823,900 tons terminated in Canada and 2,289,449 tons delivered to United States rail connections in January 1961.
