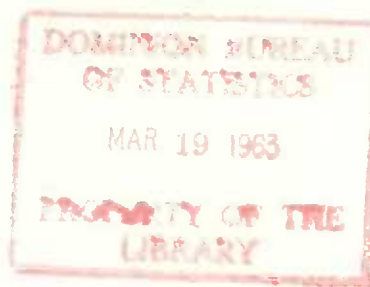

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER 1962

Presented herein are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada (C.N.R., C.P.R. and other railways having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this data.

During October, 15,448,113 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, down 5.0 per cent from 16,264,837 tons a year earlier. Of the October 1962 total, 13,547,836 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 14,387,970 tons for the same month in 1961; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose to 851,084 tons from 826,930; and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) fell slightly to 1,049,193 tons from 1,049,937.

Freight loadings by commodity groups showed decreased tonnages in three of the six major categories. The volume of animal products fell 24.2 per cent to 76,222 tons from 100,568; products of agriculture declined 13.1 per cent to 2,077,263 tons from 2,389,777, and products of mines decreased 9.7 per cent to 6,742,174 tons from 7,463,134. Loadings of forest products rose 13.9 per cent to 1,181,275 tons from 1,037,311; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 2.1 per cent to 3,368,880 tons from 3,301,083 and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) rose 6.2 per cent to 102,022 tons from 96,097.

On a provincial basis, revenue freight loadings were down in seven of the ten provinces during October 1962. Tonnages in Nova Scotia decreased 49.3 per cent (mainly as a result of an 828,000 ton overstatement by the C.N.R. of October 1961 mine products). Newfoundland reported 27.9 per cent fewer tons loaded; Alberta 16.3 per cent; Prince Edward Island 12.2 per cent; Ontario 7.6 per cent; Saskatchewan 6.4 per cent and New Brunswick 3.8 per cent. In Quebec, rail loadings increased 17.3 per cent. This was partially due to the addition of Cartier Railway Company traffic, included in this series of reports for the first time in August 1962. British Columbia loadings rose 3.5 per cent and Manitoba with 784,749 tons were up slightly from 784,398 a year earlier.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 15,457,919 tons, a drop of 5.4 per cent from 16,335,750 tons in October 1961. Of the October 1962 total 12,822,536 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including shipments delivered to water carriers), and 2,635,383 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 13,906,000 tons terminated and 2,429,750 tons delivered to United States rail connections in October 1961.

During the first ten months of the year under review, 132,693,338 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 4.6 per cent from 126,828,623 tons for the same span of 1961.
