## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER 1962

Presented herein are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada (C.N.R., C.P.R. and other railways having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this data.

During the month of November, 13,127,798 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.4 per cent from 12,460,055 tons reported by twenty-two railways a year earlier. Of the November 1962 total, 11,206,808 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 10,666,322 tons in November 1961. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose to 837,127 tons from 825,392 and overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,083,863 tons from 968,341

A breakdown of freight loadings by the six major commodity groups showed increased tonnages in four categories. Products of forests increased 12.6 per cent to 1,064,314 tons from 944,933; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 8.5 per cent to 3,287,186 tons from 3,029,869; products of mines were up 6.0 per cent to 4,449,578 tons from 4,198,243 and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 19.8 per cent to 96,464 tons from 80,504. Loadings of animals and products fell 11.9 per cent to 91,155 tons from 103,519 and agricultural products declined 3.9 per cent to 2,218,111 tons from 2,309,254.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings occurred in seven of the ten provinces. In Quebec, where operations of the Cartier Railway were included for the first time in 1962, traffic rose 23.4 per cent over the previous year. Rail movements in Manitoba increased 14.2 per cent; New Brunswick 13.8 per cent; Newfoundland 12.3 per cent; British Columbia 11.7 per cent; Saskatchewan 9.8 per cent and Nova Scotia 6.6 per cent. Decreases were reported in Prince Edward Island with 9.6 per cent less tonnage; Ontario declined 8.1 per cent and Alberta tonnages were down 7.2 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 13,186,063 tons, an increase of 5.3 per cent from 12,519,252 tons reported in November 1961. Of the November 1962 total, 10,589,033 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,597,030 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 10,340,950 tons terminated in Canada and 2,178,302 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

During the first eleven months of 1962, 145,821,136 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 4.7 per cent from 139,288,678 tons for the same period of 1961.
