## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER 1962

Presented herein are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 common carrier railways operating in Canada (C.N.R., C.P.R. and other railways having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this data.

During December, 11,412,281 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a gain of 4.1 per cent from 10,967,528 tons a year earlier. Of the December 1962 total, 9,636,891 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 9,281,372 tons in December 1961. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell slightly to 632,557 tons from 662,050 and overhead freight movements (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,142,833 tons from 1,024,106.

A breakdown of freight loadings by the six major commodity groups showed increased tonnages in three categories. Products of mines were up 6.9 per cent to 3,443,054 tons from 3,220,181; agricultural products rose 5.1 per cent to 2,032,694 tons from 1,934,131 and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 2.1 per cent to 3,009,172 tons from 2,947,828. Freight loadings of animals and products decreased 3.0 per cent to 70,288 tons from 72,467; products of forests were down 2.3 per cent to 1,011,455 tons from 1,035,700 and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 1.2 per cent to 70,228 tons from 71,065.

On a provincial basis, increased loadings were reported in six of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan's volume rose 19.3 per cent; Quebec 17.8 per cent; Newfoundland 16.1 per cent; Manitoba 13.4 per cent; Nova Scotia 10.3 per cent and Prince Edward Island 3.3 per cent. Decreases were reported in British Columbia with 11.2 per cent less tonnage; Ontario 7.0 per cent and Alberta 2.8 per cent. Tonnages in New Brunswick were only slightly lower at 298,681 tons down from 298,836 in the same month of 1961.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 11,381,310 tons, an increase of 3.5 per cent from 10,993,383 tons reported the year previous. Of the December 1962 total, 8,809,748 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,571,562 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,501,881 tons terminated in Canada and 2,491,502 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

Revenue freight traffic loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections in 1962 totalled 157,233,417 tons, an increase of 3.4 per cent from 152,114,254 tons for the year 1961.
