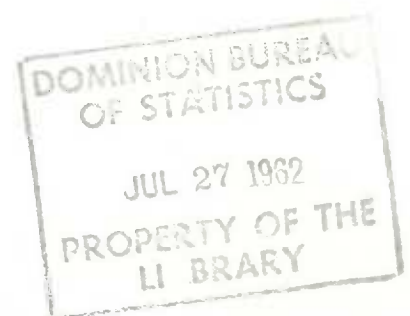

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FEBRUARY, 1962

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During February, there were 10,318,156 tons of revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.1 per cent from 9,813,713 tons for the same month of 1961. Of the February 1962 total, 8,520,142 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 7,959,566 tons a year earlier. Freight received from United States connections destined to points in Canada fell to 710,093 tons from 719,308, while intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 1,087,921 tons from 1,134,839 tons in the previous year.

All of the major commodity groups moved by rail during the period under review, with the exception of less-than-carload traffic, increased in volume over the previous year. Products of agriculture loaded in Canada amounted to 1,734,498 tons, a gain of 31.3 per cent from 1,320,878 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 3.6 per cent to 2,769,255 tons from 2,673,269; animals and products rose 2.8 per cent to 65,822 tons from 64,037; products of mines inclined 1.7 per cent to 2,698,889 tons from 2,652,619 and products of forests were up 1.1 per cent to 1,191,789 tons from 1,178,516. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) decreased 14.7 per cent to 59,889 tons from 70,247.

On a geographic basis, increases occurred in six of the ten provinces. In Saskatchewan traffic rose 41.3 per cent over the previous year; Nova Scotia 26.8 per cent; Alberta 12.7 per cent; Quebec 12.0 per cent; Prince Edward Island 11.2 per cent and British Columbia 4.4 per cent. Decreases were reported in Newfoundland where tonnages loaded were down 18.8 per cent and in Ontario where a 5.0 per cent decline was recorded. Traffic in New Brunswick and Manitoba was slightly below February 1961 levels.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 10,284,000 tons, an increase of 3.4 per cent from 9,944,347 tons reported in February 1961. Of the 1962 total, 7,872,994 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,411,006 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 7,448,913 tons terminated in Canada and 2,495,434 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

There were 21,195,685 tons of revenue freight loaded in Canada in the first two months of 1962, an increase of 7.0 per cent from 19,813,452 tons during the same period of 1961.
