RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MARCH, 1962

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During March the volume of freight carried, including loadings in Canada and receipts from United States rail connections, totalled 11,171,795 tons, an increase of 8.4 per cent over the 10,304,787 tons reported for the same period of 1961. Of the March 1962 total, tonnages loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) accounted for 9,179,005, up from 8,200,662 tons a year earlier; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada declined to 754,883 tons from 778,824, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) decreased to 1,237,907 tons from 1,325,301.

All commodity group totals in March 1962 were above year earlier levels. National loadings of agricultural products were up 21.4 per cent to 1,708,634 tons from 1,407,279; forest products rose 16.4 per cent to 1,222,397 tons from 1,050,145; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 12.5 per cent to 3,269,215 tons from 2,906,572; products of mines increased 5.2 per cent to 2,838,491 tons from 2,698,615; animals and products were up 2.5 per cent to 68,065 tons from 66,426; and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) rose 0.8 per cent to 72,203 tons from 71,625.

On a provincial basis, increased rail freight movements were recorded during March in all provinces except Ontario. Saskatchewan tonnages rose 54.1 per cent; Prince Edward Island 44.7 per cent; Nova Scotia 35.3 per cent; New Brunswick 34.4 per cent; Manitoba 16.0 per cent; British Columbia 15.5 per cent; Alberta 11.8 per cent; Quebec 6.9 per cent; and Newfoundland 2.0 per cent. Ontario traffic declined 1.3 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review amounted to 11,245,186 tons, an increase of 10.2 per cent from 10,201,266 in March 1961. Of the current total, 8,373,724 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including shipments delivered to water carriers) and 2,871,462 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 7,651,609 tons terminated and 2,549,657 tons delivered to the United States in March 1961.

During the first quarter of 1962, there were 32,367,480 tons of revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 7.5 per cent from 30,118,239 tons during the same period of 1961.
