RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

APRIL 1962

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During the month of April, 11,053,344 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections up 1.2 per cent from 10,923,839 tons in April 1961. Of the April 1962 total, 9,163,809 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 8,998,624 tons for the same month last year; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell to 708,306 tons from 749,351; and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,181,229 tons from 1,175,864.

Freight loadings by commodity groups showed increased tonnages in three of the five major categories. The volume of forest products carried rose 10.1 per cent to 1,023,772 tons from 930,148; manufactures and miscellaneous were up 8.2 per cent to 3,244,953 tons from 2,998,479, and products of mines increased 6.8 per cent to 3,207,394 tons from 3,002,334. Loadings of agricultural products declined 19.3 per cent to 1,548,495 tons from 1,919,225, animals and products decreased 10.8 per cent to 64,260 tons from 72,004, and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) was down 2.0 per cent to 74,935 tons from 76,434.

On a provincial basis, revenue freight loadings were greater in seven of the ten provinces during April 1962. Tonnages in Prince Edward Island increased 86.5 per cent; Newfoundland 21.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 14.8 per cent; British Columbia 9.7 per cent; Ontario 7.8 per cent; New Brunswick 1.7 per cent and Quebec 1.2 per cent. In Manitoba rail loadings fell 33.6 per cent, while in Saskatchewan and Alberta tonnages were down 18.5 per cent and 0.3 per cent, respectively.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 11,088,064 tons, an increase of 0.7 per cent from 11,006,870 tons in April 1961. Of the April 1962 total, 8,384,724 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including shipments delivered to water carriers), and 2,703,340 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,503,482 tons terminated and 2,503,388 tons delivered to United States connections in April 1961.

During the first four months of 1962, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections aggregated 43,420,824 tons up 5.8 per cent above the 41,042,078 tons reported for the same period of 1961.
