## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MAY 1962

Presented herein are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During May 1962, 14,388,547 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a gain of 7.9 per cent over the 13,333,453 tons reported for the same month last year. Of the May 1962 total, 12,397,739 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) compared with 11,504,521 tons reported in May 1961; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose to 881,212 tons from 794,312; and intransit movements (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 1,109,596 tons from 1,034,620.

A breakdown of freight loadings by the six major commodity groups showed increased tonnages in three of the categories. Products of mines rose 21.8 per cent to 5,725,805 tons from 4,700,195; forest products increased 17.5 per cent to 1,099,400 tons from 935,809; and manufactures and miscellaneous inclined 4.5 per cent to 3,448,745 tons from 3,299,979. Loadings of agricultural products fell 18.0 per cent to 1,970,150 tons from 2,402,080; animals and products decreased 11.4 per cent to 63,872 tons from 72,127; and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 4.8 per cent to 89,767 tons from 94,331.

On an area basis, revenue freight loadings increased in seven of the ten provinces during May 1962. Tonnages in Quebec were up 19.6 per cent; Ontario 16.6 per cent; British Columbia 14.7 per cent; Alberta 11.0 per cent; Newfoundland 8.5 per cent; New Brunswick 4.4 per cent and Nova Scotia 3.9 per cent. Manitoba loadings were down 24.3 per cent; Saskatchewan 22.5 per cent and Prince Edward Island 1.1 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated by railways operating in Canada totalled 14,366,927 tons, an increase of 7.4 per cent from 13,375,700 tons in May 1961. Of the May 1962 total, 11,831,238 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 2,535,689 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,096,445 tons terminated and 2,279,255 tons delivered to United States rail connections in May 1961.

In the January 1 to May 31 period of 1962, revenue freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections amounted to 57,809,371 tons, up 6.3 per cent from 54,375,531 tons reported a year earlier.
