

## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY 1962

Presented herein are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-two class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During July, 14,883,222 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 8.3 per cent from 13,742,254 tons for the same month of 1961. Of the July 1962 total, 3,136,508 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 12,151,410 tons a year earlier. Freight received from United States connections destined to points in Canada rose to 794,328 tons from 721,679, and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 952,386 tons from 869,165.

A breakdown of freight loadings by the six major commodity groups showed increased tonnages in four categories. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) was up 30.5 per cent to 113,134 tons from 86,660; products of mines rose 23.1 per cent to 7,036,765 tons from 5,716,859; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 12.6 per cent to 3,176,722 tons from 2,821,827; products of forests inclined 10.8 per cent to 1,286,928 tons from 1,161,556. Loadings of agricultural products fell 36.2 per cent to 1,460,582 tons from 2,290,380, and animals and products decreased 15.9 per cent to 62,377 tons from 74,128. A trucker's strike, which began in Montreal in mid-April and later spread into the province of Ontario, ended during the first week of July 1962.

On a geographic basis, increases occurred in seven of the ten provinces. In Nova Scotia, traffic rose 50.0 per cent over the previous year; Quebec increased 24.1 per cent; Newfoundland 12.5 per cent; Ontario 7.6 per cent; British Columbia 5.7 per cent; Alberta 3.3 per cent and Manitoba 0.5 per cent. Decreases were reported in Saskatchewan, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick where tonnages loaded were down 40.6 per cent; 23.2 per cent and 7.9 per cent, respectively.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 14,865,106 tons, an increase of 8.2 per cent from 13,734,384 tons reported in July 1961. Of the 1962 total, 12,642,314 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,222,792 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,697,515 tons terminated in Canada and 2,036,869 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

There were 87,584,702 tons of revenue freight loaded in Canada during the first seven months of 1962, an increase of 6.2 per cent from 82,472,986 tons during the same period of 1961.
