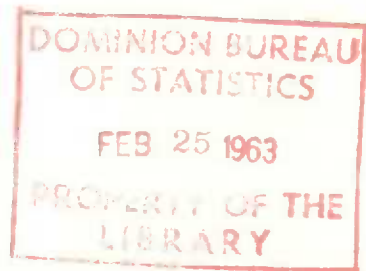

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER 1962

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty - three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (common carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these data.

During September, 14,352,959 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 4.6 per cent from 13,716,321 tons a year earlier. Of the September 1962 total, 12,750,034 tons were loaded in Canada (including imports at lake or ocean ports) as against 12,084,655 tons for the same month in 1961. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell to 697,712 tons from 729,746 and intransit freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased to 905,213 tons from 901,920.

Freight loadings by commodity showed increases in three of the six major categories. Products of forests increased 15.1 per cent to 1,225,261 tons from 1,064,917; mine products rose 14.5 per cent to 6,840,716 tons from 5,975,904; and manufactures and miscellaneous were up 3.1 per cent to 3,094,592 tons from 3,001,687. Loadings of agricultural products decreased 23.3 per cent to 1,444,120 tons from 1,882,058; animals and products declined 16.9 per cent to 65,543 tons from 78,845; and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 1.8 per cent to 79,802 tons from 81,244.

On an area basis, the volume of revenue freight traffic was greater in seven of the ten provinces. Tonnages in Nova Scotia increased 30.3 per cent; Manitoba 16.7 per cent; New Brunswick 14.4 per cent; Quebec 11.8 per cent; Newfoundland 11.7 per cent; British Columbia 6.5 per cent and Ontario 3.0 per cent. Revenue freight loadings fell 15.3 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 14.8 per cent in Alberta and 11.5 per cent in Saskatchewan.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 14,343,285 tons, an increase of 5.2 per cent from 13,637,637 tons in September 1961. Of the September 1962 total, 12,114,739 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including shipments delivered to water carriers), and 2,228,546 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,490,549 tons terminated and 2,147,088 tons delivered to United States rail connections in the previous September.

During the first nine months of 1962, the volume of freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 117,245,225 tons, up 6.0 per cent from 110,563,786 tons for the same period of 1961.
