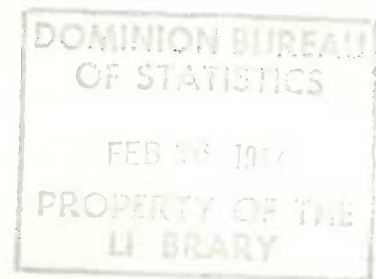

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During October 1963, tons of revenue freight loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 17,439,742 tons, an increase of 12.9 per cent from October 1962. This increase reflected the large export movements of wheat and other grains to foreign markets. Of the 17,439,742 tons carried by rail in Canada, 15,408,796 tons were domestic loadings (including receipts from water lines) a gain of 13.7 per cent from the year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 0.1 per cent to 851,618 tons and overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada, increased 12.4 per cent to 1,179,338 tons.

Revenue freight loadings by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories during the month under review. Products of agriculture increased 52.4 per cent to 3,166,133 tons; forest products were up 9.3 per cent to 1,290,847 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 8.9 per cent to 3,669,544 tons, and products of mines increased 5.7 per cent to 7,127,847 tons. Loadings of animals and products decreased 7.1 per cent to 70,830 tons, and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 18.1 per cent to 83,595 tons.

On a geographic basis, revenue freight loadings increased in all provinces excepting Quebec. Saskatchewan tonnages were up 58.2 per cent; Prince Edward Island 49.8 per cent; Newfoundland 47.6 per cent; Manitoba 28.6 per cent; Alberta 17.2 per cent; Ontario 15.6 per cent; New Brunswick 15.3 per cent; Nova Scotia 15.1 per cent and British Columbia 13.7 per cent. In Quebec, tonnages declined 4.3 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail connections during October 1963, increased 12.3 per cent to 17,360,096 tons. Of this total, 14,519,162 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,840,934 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the ten-month period from January 1 to October 31, 141,439,207 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 6.6 per cent from the similar 1962 period.
