RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these tables.

During November 1963, a total of 14,881,516 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 13.4 per cent over the corresponding month of 1962. This advancement was mainly due to increased shipments of iron ore and wheat, which in each case approximated 2 million tons, nearly doubling that of the year earlier month. Iron ore movements, although influenced somewhat by the greater activity of recently-developed deposits in the Coral Lake Region of Quebec, were generally higher in both that province and in Ontario. Increased loadings of wheat reflected the large export movements to the U.S.S.R. and other foreign markets.

Of the 14,881,516 tons carried in November 1963, 12,936,227 tons were loaded in Canada (including waterborne receipts), up 15.4 per cent from November 1962; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada dropped 3.2 per cent to 810,414 tons and overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada, increased 4.7 per cent to 1,134,875 tons.

Revenue freight loadings by commodity groups showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of agriculture increased 46.5 per cent to 3,250,502 tons; mines and products 14.3 per cent to 5,084,537 tons; forest products 3.4 per cent to 1,100,318 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous 1.8 per cent to 3,347,542 tons. Animals and products decreased 10.2 per cent to 81,812 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 25.9 per cent to 71,516 tons.

On an area basis, revenue freight loadings increased in seven of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan rail loadings were up 30.6 per cent; Quebec 29.3 per cent; Alberta 22.0 per cent; Prince Edward Island 20.1 per cent; Manitoba 14.7 per cent; Ontario 9.0 per cent and British Columbia 3.2 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland decreased by 20.5 per cent; New Brunswick 8.9 per cent and Nova Scotia 0.3 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada and delivered to United States rail connections during November 1963, increased 13.1 per cent to 14,911,507 tons. Of this total, 12,307,330 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,604,177 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the eleven-month period, January to November, 156,320,723 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 7.2 per cent over the same period of 1962.
