

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one percent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these tables.

During December 1963, a total of 14,054,667 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 23.2 per cent over the same month a year earlier. This gain was attributable in part to increased loadings of wheat and iron ore. Of the total tons carried in December, 12,149,687 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), up 26.1 per cent from December 1962; 689,609 tons were received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada, a 9.0 per cent increase; and 1,215,371 tons moved as overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada, up 6.3 per cent from December 1962.

Revenue freight loadings at points in Canada, by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in all of the six major categories. Products of agriculture, mainly as a result of increased exports, increased 47.6 per cent to 2,999,764 tons; mines and products, with greater iron ore activities in Quebec, rose 31.9 per cent to 4,542,799 tons; less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) 18.9 per cent to 83,523 tons; forest products 10.9 per cent to 1,121,738 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous 10.6 per cent to 3,327,905 tons and animals and products 5.2 per cent to 73,958 tons.

On a provincial basis, revenue freight loadings increased in all areas with the exception of Nova Scotia. Tonnages loaded in Quebec were up 58.6 per cent; Alberta 39.5 per cent; Saskatchewan 33.8 per cent; Ontario 17.6 per cent; Prince Edward Island 17.4 per cent; British Columbia 12.5 per cent; Manitoba 9.2 per cent; New Brunswick 6.8 per cent, and Newfoundland .0.2 per cent. Loadings in Nova Scotia decreased by 11.9 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated in Canada and delivered to United States rail connections during the month under review totalled 14,085,259 tons, an increase of 23.8 per cent over December 1962. Of the December 1963 total, 11,410,630 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,674,629 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

Railways operating in Canada carried 170,339,884 tons of revenue freight (including domestic loadings and receipts from U.S. connections) an increase of 8.3 per cent from 1962.
