## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FEBRUARY 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The February 1963 statistics include operations of the Cartier Railway while previous year figures do not. The Cartier Railway commenced operations in 1962 and was presented in this series for the first time in August of that year. Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with average revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railway is not duplicated in this report.

During February 1963 twenty-three carriers reported 10,760,852 tons of revenue freight carried and received from United States rail connections, up 4.3 per cent from that reported by twenty-two railways in February 1962. Of the February 1963 total, 8,960,643 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines) up 5.2 per cent from the same month last year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 2.3 per cent to 726,275 tons and overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) declined 1.3 per cent to 1,073,934 tons.

Revenue freight loadings reported in the month under review, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of mines increased 14.6 per cent to 3,091,896; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 9.9 per cent to 3,042,409 tons; and forest products were up 1.3 per cent to 1,207,088 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 16.4 per cent to 69,685 tons. Loadings of agricultural products declined 14.3 per cent to 1,487,126 tons and animals and products decreased 5.1 per cent to 62,439 tons.

On a provincial basis, all provinces with the exception of New Brunswick reported increased freight loadings. Newfoundland tonnages were up 54.8 per cent; Prince Edward Island 20.3 per cent; Manitoba 18.3 per cent; Nova Scotia 16.3 per cent; Quebec and British Columbia 7.7 per cent; Alberta 4.1 per cent; Ontario 1.1 per cent and Saskatchewan 0.3 per cent. Loadings in New Brunswick fell 11.3 per cent.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 10,807,631 tons, an increase of 5.1 per cent over the corresponding month of 1962. Of the February 1963 total, 8,318,322 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,489,309 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 7,872,994 tons terminated in Canada and 2,411,006 tons delivered to United States rail connections in February 1962.

During the first two months of 1963, 22,398,941 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.7 per cent from the same period in 1962.
