Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The March 1963 statistics include operations of the Cartier Railway while previous year figures do not. The Cartier Railway commenced operations in 1962 and was presented in this series for the first time in August of that year. Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During March 1963, twenty-three carriers reported 11,742,678 tons of revenue freight loaded and received from United States rail connections, up 5.1 per cent from that reported by twenty-two railways in March 1962. The addition of the Cartier Railway tonnage accounts for 4.6 per cent of the increase. Of the March 1963 total, 9,718,690 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) up 5.9 per cent from the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 7.0 per cent to 807,493 tons, and overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) fell 1.7 per cent to 1,216,495 tons.

Freight loadings by commodity groups showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Mine products increased 21.7 per cent to 3,453,079 tons; less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) rose 6.4 per cent to 76,847 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous were up 3.9 per cent to 3,396,354 tons and forest products rose 2.0 per cent to 1,246,396 tons. Loadings of agricultural products declined 13.4 per cent to 1,479,598 tons and animals and products decreased 2.4 per cent to 66,416 tons.

On a provincial basis, increased loadings were reported in seven of the ten provinces. Quebec tonnages were up 31.4 per cent; Newfoundland 27.1 per cent; Nova Scotia 18.8 per cent; Manitoba 6.1 per cent; British Columbia 4.2 per cent; Prince Edward Island 3.2 per cent and Saskatchewan 0.4 per cent. Loadings in New Brunswick fell 12.0 per cent; Alberta 9.3 per cent and Ontario 2.2 per cent.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during March 1963 totalled 11,855,642 tons, an increase of 5.4 per cent over the same month last year. Of the March 1963 total, 9,034,429 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,821,213 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,373,724 tons terminated in Canada and 2,871,462 tons delivered to United States rail connections in 1962.

During the first three months of 1963, the volume of freight loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, rose 5.5 per cent to 34,141,619 tons from the same period of 1962. Again 3.5 per cent of this increase was attributable to the addition of the Cartier Railway tonnage.
