RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

APRIL 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The April 1963 statistics include operations of the Cartier Railway Co. which began reporting in August 1962 for the first time. Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During April, 11,986,077 tons of revenue freight were loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 8.4 per cent from the previous year. Of this total, 10,044,170 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines) a gain of 9.6 per cent, while 738,185 tons were freight receipts from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada which rose 4.2 per cent. An additional 1,203,722 tons which moved overhead through Canada was up 1.9 per cent from April 1962.

A breakdown of freight loadings by commodity groups, shows increased tonnages in five of the six categories. Products of mines rose 24.5 per cent to 3,991,970 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 8.6 per cent to 3,523,336 tons, animals and products were up 1.0 per cent to 64,888 tons and forest products were up 0.2 per cent to 1,026,106 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 5.1 per cent to 78,756 tons. Loadings of agricultural products, down 12.2 per cent to 1,359,114 tons, was the only commodity group to register a decline.

On a provincial basis, increased freight loadings were reported in six of the ten provinces. In Quebec tonnages were up 43.3 per cent. This was due in part, however, to Cartier Railway Company operations, statistics of which are included in April 1963 but not in the corresponding month of the earlier year. Nova Scotia rose 34.8 per cent; Saskatchewan 31.1 per cent; Manitoba 14.0 per cent; New Brunswick 11.5 per cent and Newfoundland 8.5 per cent. In Alberta freight loadings fell 17.5 per cent and in Prince Edward Island the volume of freight loaded was down 8.1 per cent. Ontario and British Columbia registered declines of 6.7 and 4.0 per cent, respectively.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 11,921,269 tons, an increase of 7.5 per cent over April 1962. Of the April 1963 total, 9,122,788 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,798,481 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,384,724 tons terminated in Canada and 2,703,340 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

During the first four months of 1963, 46,127,696 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 6.2 per cent from the same period of 1962.
