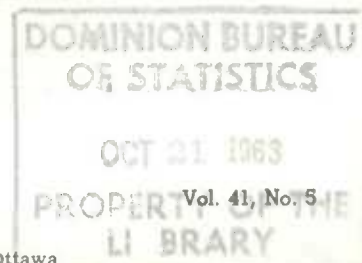

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MAY 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually. In comparing monthly traffic statistics for 1963 with those of the previous year, it should be noted that Cartier Railway Company operations in Quebec, whose traffic is 99 per cent iron ore, were first included in this series in August, 1962. May 1963 figures therefore include Cartier Railway operations while those of a year earlier do not. Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with average revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During May 1963, twenty-three carriers reported a total of 15,829,273 tons of revenue freight loaded and received from United States rail connections, up 10.0 per cent from that reported by twenty-two railways in May 1962. Of the 1963 total, 13,840,806 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), up 11.6 per cent from the same month a year earlier. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada, dropped 2.7 per cent to 856,988 tons and overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased 2.0 per cent to 1,131,479 tons.

Revenue freight loadings reported in the month under review, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of mines increased 19.9 per cent to 6,862,749; manufactures and miscellaneous were up 9.0 per cent to 3,758,601; and products of agriculture rose 1.1 per cent to 1,990,904 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased 9.6 per cent to 98,368 tons. Loadings of animals and products dropped 6.2 per cent to 59,898 tons and products of forests declined 2.6 per cent to 1,070,286 tons.

On a provincial basis, increased loadings were reported in five of the ten provinces. Quebec tonnages were up 36.4 per cent; Saskatchewan 27.1 per cent; Manitoba 26.8 per cent; Nova Scotia 13.2 per cent; and New Brunswick 5.5 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland fell 21.7 per cent; Prince Edward Island 12.8 per cent; Alberta 11.6 per cent; British Columbia 4.3 per cent; and Ontario 3.8 per cent.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during May 1963, totalled 15,626,598 tons, an increase of 8.8 per cent over the corresponding month in 1962. Of the May 1963 total, 12,995,728 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,630,870 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 11,831,238 tons terminated in Canada and 2,535,689 tons delivered to United States rail connections a year earlier.

During the first five months of 1963, 61,956,969 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 7.2 per cent from the same period in 1962.
