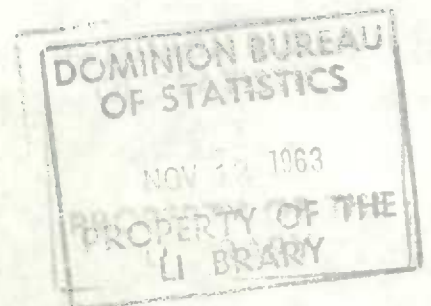

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JUNE 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). The June 1963 statistics include operations of the Cartier Railway Co. which began reporting and have been included in this series since August 1962. Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated herein.

During June, 14,873,593 tons of revenue freight were loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, down 0.1 per cent from June 1962. Of the June 1963 total, 13,074,786 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), a 0.3 per cent decline from the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 0.1 per cent to 806,144 tons, and overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada, increased 2.2 per cent to 992,663 tons.

An analysis of revenue freight loadings, by commodity groups shows tonnage decreases in four of the six major categories during the month under review. Animals and products fell 7.4 per cent to 55,587 tons; mines and mine products declined 2.8 per cent to 6,521,171 tons and forest products decreased 0.5 per cent to 1,269,314 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) registered the largest decline, dropping 45.6 per cent to 76,296 tons. It should be noted that previous year l.c.l. loadings were perhaps inflated as a result of the trucker's strike which began in Montreal in early April 1962; spread into Ontario in late May; and ended during the first week of July. Products of agriculture rose 12.1 per cent to 1,777,093 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 0.8 per cent to 3,375,325 tons.

On a provincial basis, decreases in tonnages of revenue freight loaded were reported in five of the ten provinces. Newfoundland movements dropped 19.1 per cent; Prince Edward Island 17.0 per cent; Alberta 8.5 per cent; Ontario 7.1 per cent and Quebec 3.5 per cent. In Saskatchewan, freight tonnages loaded increased 31.1 per cent; New Brunswick 16.1 per cent; Manitoba 7.4 per cent; British Columbia 6.5 per cent and Nova Scotia 3.1 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month decreased 1.2 per cent to 14,674,999 tons. Of the June 1963 total, 12,295,939 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,379,070 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 12,498,486 tons terminated in Canada and 2,350,533 tons delivered to United States rail connections in June 1962.

During the first half of 1963, 76,830,562 tons of revenue freight were loaded by rail in Canada and received from United States connections, an increase of 5.7 per cent over the similar six-month period a year earlier.
