RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. To avoid duplication, interchanges of freight between Canadian railways are excluded. Included herein are statistics of the Cartier Railway Company, which commenced reporting in August 1962.

During July, 15,433,720 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 3.7 per cent from July 1962. Of the July 1963 total, 13,580,519 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines) for an increase of 3.4 per cent from the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 4.2 per cent to 827,750 tons, and overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada rose 7.7 per cent to 1,025,451 tons.

Revenue freight loadings reported in the month under review, showed increased tonnages in three of the six major categories. Products of agriculture increased 19.0 per cent to 1,737,800 tons; forest products were up 10.3 per cent to 1,419,644 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 6.6 per cent to 3,385,179 tons. Decreased tonnages were reported in each of the following commodity groups; less-than-carload freight, (l.c.l.) 21.5 per cent to 88,763; animals and products 6.3 per cent to 58,447 and mines and products 2.1 per cent to 6,890,686.

On a provincial basis, increased revenue freight loadings were reported in six of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan tonnages increased 42.0 per cent; Manitoba 24.9 per cent; New Brunswick 22.8 per cent; British Columbia 20.1 per cent; Prince Edward Island 19.6 per cent and Ontario 0.5 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland decreased 20.0 per cent; Nova Scotia 15.2 per cent; Alberta 5.3 per cent and Quebec 2.2 per cent.

Freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during July 1963, increased 3.2 per cent to 15,345,772 tons. Of this total, 12,764,229 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,581,543 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first seven months of 1963, 92,264,282 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 5.3 per cent over the same period of 1962.
