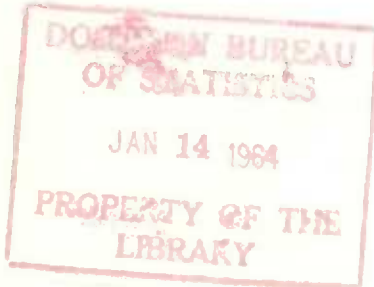

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

AUGUST 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During August, 15,520,885 tons of revenue freight were loaded on lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 1.4 per cent from August 1962. Of the August 1963 total, 13,789,012 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), a gain of 2.7 per cent from the same month last year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell 14.2 per cent to 749,860 tons and overhead freight, United States to United States through Canada, declined 2.1 per cent to 982,013 tons.

Revenue freight loadings by commodity groups, show increased tonnages in three of the six major categories during the month under review. Products of agriculture increased 9.0 per cent to 1,834,949 tons; forest products were up 6.8 per cent to 1,477,613 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 5.9 per cent to 3,335,041 tons. Loadings of animals and products decreased 6.7 per cent to 58,883 tons; mine products declined 0.8 per cent to 6,998,499 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 14.4 per cent to 84,027 tons.

On an area basis revenue freight loadings were higher in seven of the ten provinces. Prince Edward Island led with a 40.0 per cent increase; Nova Scotia increased 28.5 per cent; Saskatchewan 27.4 per cent; New Brunswick 15.7 per cent; British Columbia 11.4 per cent; Manitoba 8.0 per cent and Newfoundland 1.0 per cent. Loadings in Alberta decreased 9.5 per cent; Quebec 5.3 per cent and Ontario 1.0 per cent.

Freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during August 1963 increased 0.8 per cent to 15,460,170 tons. Of this total, 12,940,987 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,519,183 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the eight-month period from January 1 to August 31, 107,785,167 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 4.8 per cent over the similar 1962 period.
