## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER 1963

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with average annual revenues of less than \$500,000), whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During September, 16,214,288 tons of revenue freight were carried by railways in Canada, an increase of 13.0 per cent from September 1962. This increase was largely due to a 48.1 per cent rise in iron ore loadings in Quebec and a 23.8 per cent gain in wheat loadings in the prairie provinces. The latter marked the beginning of large export movements resulting from sales announced by the Minister of Trade and Commerce September 10, 1963.

Of the total 16,214,288 tons carried by rail during the month under review, loadings in Canada amounted to 14,520,670 tons, up 13.9 per cent from 1962; freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada accounted for 745,946 tons, up 6.9 per cent; and overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) accounted for 947,672 tons, an increase of 4.7 per cent.

Revenue freight loadings by commodity groups showed increased tonnages in five of the six major categories. Products of agriculture increased 30.6 per cent to 1,885,619 tons; mines and products 16.8 per cent to 7,987,795 tons; less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) 10.4 per cent to 88,126 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous 5.6 per cent to 3,266,881 tons and forest products 0.8 per cent to 1,235,079 tons. Animals and products dropped 12.8 per cent to 57,170 tons.

On an area basis, revenue freight loadings increased in six of the ten provinces. Saskatchewan led with a 38.2 per cent increase in tonnages; Prince Edward Island registered a rise of 33.3 per cent; Quebec 28.5 per cent; Manitoba 20.5 per cent; British Columbia 4.6 per cent and Ontario 1.5 per cent. Loadings in Newfoundland decreased by 8.9 per cent; New Brunswick by 7.6 per cent; Alberta by 2.1 per cent and Nova Scotia by 0.1 per cent.

Revenue freight unloaded by rail in Canada during September 1963, increased 12.1 per cent to 16,071,752 tons. Of this total, 13,714,118 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) while 2,357,634 tons were delivered to United States rail connections.

During the first three quarters of 1963, 123,999,455 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, an increase of 5.8 per cent over the same period of 1962.
