

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JANUARY 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these tables.

Although many of the carriers whose statistics are contained in this report have adopted the new Standard Transportation Commodity Code of the Association of American Railroads, effective January 1, 1964, data in this series continues to be presented in accordance with the Freight Commodity Statistics Classification. Some initial difficulties were encountered by the railways in converting the new code to that appearing in this publication.

During January 1964 revenue freight loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 13,827,535 tons, up 18.8 per cent from January 1963. Of this total, 11,793,628 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), a gain of 20.7 per cent while receipts from U.S. connections destined to points in Canada aggregated 768,085 tons, 9.1 per cent above the previous year. Overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased 12.5 per cent to 1,265,822 tons.

Freight loadings by commodity group, showed increases in mine products (25.6 per cent); agricultural products (22.2 per cent); forest products (18.3 per cent) and manufactures and miscellaneous tonnages (16.6 per cent to 3,643,253). Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) dropped 15.9 per cent to 60,572 tons and animals and products declined 2.5 per cent to 65,509 tons.

On a provincial basis, increased loadings were reported in seven of the ten provinces. Quebec tonnages were up 53.8 per cent; Alberta 27.9 per cent; Saskatchewan 20.2 per cent; Ontario 17.7 per cent; Newfoundland 15.6 per cent; British Columbia 14.5 per cent and New Brunswick 1.2 per cent. Loadings in Nova Scotia fell 15.7 per cent; Prince Edward Island 1.8 per cent and Manitoba 0.2 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 13,781,335 tons, an increase of 18.0 per cent from January 1963. Of the January 1964 total, 10,838,321 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,943,014 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 9,206,801 tons terminated in Canada and 2,474,300 tons delivered to United States rail connections in 1963.
