## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During October, 18,463,565 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.9 per cent from October 1963. Of the October 1964 total, 16,463,152 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) an increase of 6.8 per cent; freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada amounted to 834,248 tons, down 2.0 per cent, and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) totalled 1,166,165 tons, a decline of 1.1 per cent.

Revenue freight loadings in the month under review, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines rose 13.9 per cent to 8,116,367 tons; animals and products increased 10.5 per cent to 78,290 tons; forest products were up 6.1 per cent to 1,368,957 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 4.6 per cent to 3,838,058 tons. Products of agriculture declined 5.9 per cent to 2,979,158 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) decreased 1.5 per cent to 82,322 tons.

On a geographic basis, increased revenue freight loadings were reported in six of the ten provinces. In Quebec, tonnages were up 19.7 per cent; Ontario and Newfoundland each reported an increase of 8.7 per cent; New Brunswick 5.9 per cent; Alberta 1.7 per cent and Prince Edward Island 1.0 per cent. Saskatchewan loadings fell 6.0 per cent; British Columbia 4.3 per cent; Manitoba 1.4 per cent and Nova Scotia 0.6 per cent.

Revenue freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during October 1964 totalled 18,290,530 tons, up 5.4 per cent from the same month of 1963. Of the 1964 month total, 15,527,541 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,762,989 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 14,519,162 tons terminated in Canada and 2,840,934 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in October 1963.

During the ten months from January through October, 166,382,731 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 17.7 per cent over the corresponding 1963 period.
