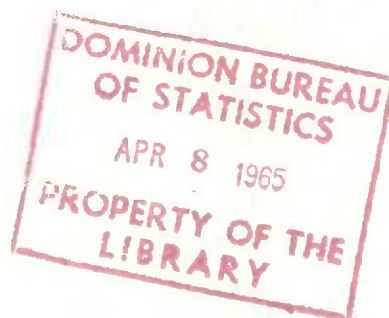

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

NOVEMBER 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During November, tons of revenue freight loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections totalled 16,394,353, up 10.2 per cent over November 1963. Of this total, 14,206,812 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) a gain of 9.8 per cent; freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada amounted to 871,440 tons an increase of 7.5 per cent; overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) accounted for 1,316,101 tons, up 16.0 per cent.

During the month under review, revenue freight loadings increased in five of the six major commodity groups. Products of mines were up 23.8 per cent to 6,293,957 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous rose 12.9 per cent to 3,780,600 tons; forest products gained 12.0 per cent to 1,232,486 tons; animals and products increased 11.8 per cent to 91,462 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) increased slightly to 71,575 tons. Products of agriculture, which had moved upward in November 1963 due to heavy wheat exports, were down 15.8 per cent to 2,736,732 tons in the 1964 period.

On a regional basis, eight of the ten provinces reported increased freight loadings in November 1964. New Brunswick tonnages were up 24.4 per cent; Ontario 24.0 per cent; Quebec 17.5 per cent; British Columbia 9.3 per cent; Prince Edward Island 8.8 per cent; Manitoba 4.0 per cent; Nova Scotia 0.3 per cent and Alberta 0.1 per cent. Loadings in Saskatchewan fell 15.1 per cent and Newfoundland decreased 0.3 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 16,378,645 tons, a gain of 9.8 per cent from the same month last year. Of the November 1964 total, 13,529,552 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,849,093 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 12,307,330 tons terminated in Canada and 2,604,177 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in November 1963.

During the first eleven months of 1964, a total of 182,777,084 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 17.0 per cent over the corresponding period of 1963.
