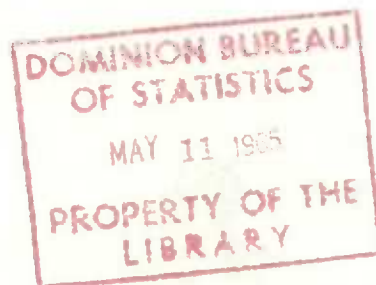

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

DECEMBER 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During the month under review, a total of 15,575,519 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 10.8 per cent from December 1963. Of the December 1964 total, 13,412,707 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), a gain of 10.4 per cent over the previous year; freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 817,973 tons, up 18.6 per cent and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) amounted to 1,344,839 tons, an increase of 10.7 per cent.

Freight loadings, by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of mines rose 28.3 per cent to 5,828,332 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous gained 16.2 per cent to 3,868,611 tons; forest products increased 14.3 per cent to 1,282,621 tons and animals and products were up 8.7 per cent to 80,361 tons. Products of agriculture fell 23.9 per cent to 2,282,564 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 15.9 per cent to 70,218 tons.

On a provincial basis, all provinces with the exception of Saskatchewan reported increased tonnages during December 1964. Freight loadings were up 33.8 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 32.0 per cent in Nova Scotia; 25.4 per cent in Ontario; 21.5 per cent in Newfoundland; 13.2 per cent in Manitoba; 13.1 per cent in New Brunswick; 9.5 per cent in Quebec; 8.5 per cent in Alberta and 7.7 per cent in British Columbia. Freight loadings decreased 21.8 per cent in Saskatchewan.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during the month under review, totalled 15,622,413 tons, an increase of 10.9 per cent over the same month a year earlier. Of the 1964 month total, 12,681,495 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,940,918 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 11,410,630 tons terminated in Canada and 2,674,629 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in December 1963.

During the year 1964, a total of 198,336,565 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 16.4 per cent over the year 1963.
