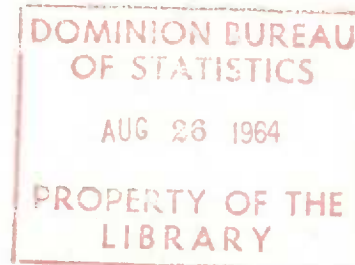

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

FEBRUARY 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in these tables.

During February, 13,321,581 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 23.8 per cent from February 1963. Of this total, 11,348,103 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), a gain of 26.6 per cent; overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased 21.7 per cent to 1,306,579 tons while receipts from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada declined 8.2 per cent to 666,899 tons.

Freight loadings by commodity groups showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of mines rose 36.6 per cent to 4,224,786 tons; agricultural products increased 35.6 per cent to 2,016,537 tons; forest products rose 18.9 per cent to 1,435,138 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous were up 16.6 per cent to 3,547,854 tons. Loadings of animals and products decreased 0.9 per cent to 61,857 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 11.1 per cent to 61,931 tons.

On a provincial basis, revenue freight loadings increased in all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island. Quebec tonnages were up 58.9 per cent; Alberta 34.1 per cent; New Brunswick 24.1 per cent; Saskatchewan 20.7 per cent; Ontario 19.2 per cent; Manitoba 14.5 per cent; Newfoundland 13.9 per cent; British Columbia 12.2 per cent and Nova Scotia 4.3 per cent. Loadings in Prince Edward Island fell 12.5 per cent.

Revenue freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during the month under review totalled 13,015,235 tons, an increase of 20.4 per cent from February 1963. Of the February 1964 total, 10,143,805 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,871,430 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 8,318,322 tons terminating in Canada and 2,489,309 tons delivered to United States rail connections.

For the first two months of 1964, 27,143,754 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 21.2 per cent over the similar period of 1963.
