RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

MARCH 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During March, 14,578,416 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 24.1 per cent over March 1963. Of this total, 12,558,520 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), a gain of 29.2 per cent over the previous year. Freight received from United States rail connections destined to points in Canada fell 12.1 per cent to 709,811 tons while overhead freight (United States to United States through Canada) increased 7.7 per cent to 1,310,085 tons.

Revenue freight loadings by commodity groups, shows tonnage increases in four of the six major categories during the month under review. Agricultural products rose 41.9 per cent to 2,099,051 tons; mine products were up 38.9 per cent to 4,797,976 tons; forest products increased 23.3 per cent to 1,536,957 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous rose 17.6 per cent to 3,993,284 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 14.1 per cent to 66,046 tons and animals and products decreased 1.8 per cent to 65,206 tons.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings were reported in all provinces in March 1964. Quebec tonnages were up 49.5 per cent; Alberta 43.6 per cent; Ontario 31.1 per cent; Manitoba 18.3 per cent; New Brunswick 18.2 per cent; British Columbia 15.7 per cent; Saskatchewan 11.6 per cent; Prince Edward Island 9.8 per cent; Newfoundland 4.5 per cent and Nova Scotia 4.2 per cent.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada totalled 14,389,799 tons an increase of 21.4 per cent from the same month last year. Of the March 1964 total, 11,388,696 tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 3,001,103 tons were delivered to United States rail connections. This compares with 9,034,429 tons terminating in Canada and 2,821,213 tons delivered to United States rail connections in March 1963.

During the first quarter of 1964, 41,722,170 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 22.2 per cent from the similar 1963 period.
