## RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

APRIL 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During the month of April, 15,151,234 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a gain of 26.8 per cent over April 1963. Of the current year total, 13,130,343 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), up 31.2 per cent; 1,322,095 tons represented overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada), up 9.8 per cent, while 698,796 tons of freight were received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada, a decline of 5.3 per cent from the previous year.

Revenue freight loadings reported in the month under review, showed increased tonnages in four of the six major categories. Products of agriculture increased 74.2 per cent to 2,367,079 tons; mines and products rose 35.7 per cent to 5,417,627 tons; forest products were up 18.4 per cent to 1,215,111 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous increased 13.3 per cent to 3,993,481 tons. Animals and products decreased 3.3 per cent to 62,715 tons and less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) was down 5.6 per cent to 74,330 tons.

On a provincial basis, all areas excepting Nova Scotia reported increased freight loadings. Tonnages in Alberta were up 56.9 per cent; in Quebec 48.7 per cent; in Manitoba 46.3 per cent; in Saskatchewan 40.6 per cent; in Ontario 23.3 per cent; in New Brunswick 18.9 per cent; in Prince Edward Island 14.6 per cent; in British Columbia 12.7 per cent and in Newfoundland 4.5 per cent. Loadings in Nova Scotia fell off 2.2 per cent.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during April 1964 totalled 14,971,003 tons, an increase of 26.0 per cent over the corresponding month of 1963. Of the April 1964 total, 11,923,067 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 3,047,936 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 9,087,282 tons terminated in Canada and 2,798,481 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in April 1963.

During the first four months of 1964, 56,873,404 tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 23.4 per cent from the same period in 1963.
