



RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JUNE 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During the month under review, a total of 18,819,771 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 26.5 per cent from June 1963. Of the June 1964 total, 16,742,486 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) a gain of 28.1 per cent over the previous year; overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) amounted to 1,192,115 tons an increase of 20.1 per cent; and freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada totalled 885,170 tons, up 9.8 per cent.

Freight loadings by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in five of the six major categories. Products of agriculture, reflecting increased wheat shipments to overseas markets, were up 70.5 per cent to 3,029,987 tons; mines and products gained 27.6 per cent to 8,318,703 tons; animals and products rose 17.9 per cent to 65,515 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 16.9 per cent to 3,944,921 tons and forest products were up 3.1 per cent to 1,308,865 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 2.4 per cent to 74,495 tons.

On a regional basis, eight of the ten provinces reported increased tonnages during June 1964. Freight loadings were up 64.5 per cent in Alberta; 62.5 per cent in Saskatchewan; 40.3 per cent in Quebec; 26.9 per cent in Prince Edward Island; 18.4 per cent in New Brunswick; 17.3 per cent in Ontario; 3.5 per cent in British Columbia and 0.3 per cent in Nova Scotia. Loadings fell 17.8 per cent in Newfoundland and 0.3 per cent in Manitoba.

Revenue freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during June 1964, totalled 18,608,844 tons, an increase of 26.8 per cent over the previous year. Of the current year total, 15,857,417 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,751,427 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 12,295,939 tons terminated in Canada and 2,379,060 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in June 1963.

During the first half of 1964, a total of 92,912,707 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 21.0 per cent over the corresponding period of 1963.
