RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JULY 1964

Presented in this report are the revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During July, 18,743,219 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 21.4 per cent from July 1963. Of this total, 16,771,671 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) for a gain of 23.5 per cent; overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) totalled 1,144,122 tons up 11.6 per cent. Freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada fell slightly to 827,426 tons.

Freight loadings by commodity groups, showed increased tonnages in five of the six major categories. Products of agriculture rose 72.5 per cent to 2,997,343 tons; mines and products gained 21.7 per cent to 8,385,079 tons; animals and products increased 17.7 per cent to 68,785 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous inclined 10.8 per cent to 3,751,137 tons and forest products were up 4.9 per cent to 1,489,644 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 10.2 per cent to 79,683 tons.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings were reported in eight of the ten provinces during the month under review. Saskatchewan tonnages were up 71.4 per cent; Alberta 57.4 per cent; Newfoundland 27.0 per cent; Quebec 22.8 per cent; Ontario 20.0 per cent; New Brunswick 12.5 per cent; Nova Scotia 11.1 per cent and British Columbia 2.4 per cent. Loadings in Prince Edward Island and Manitoba fell 28.9 and 17.1 per cent respectively.

During the current month, 18,594,330 tons of revenue freight terminated in Canada and delivered to U.S. rail connections, up 21.2 per cent from the previous year. Of the July 1964 total, 15,959,494 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,634,836 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 12,764,229 tons terminated in Canada and 2,581,543 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in July 1963.

During the period January 1 to July 31, 1964, a total of 111,655,926 tons of freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, a gain of 21.1 per cent over the corresponding 1963 period.
