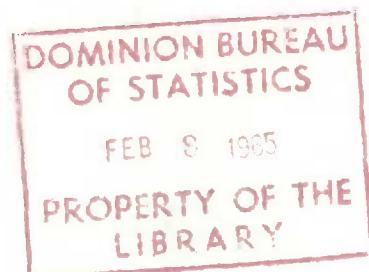

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

SEPTEMBER 1964

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded herein are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this report.

During September, 18,700,249 tons of revenue freight were loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 15.3 per cent from the previous year. Of the September 1964 total, 16,730,002 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers) an increase of 15.2 per cent; freight received from U.S. rail connections destined in points in Canada amounted to 774,326 tons for a gain of 3.8 per cent and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) totalled 1,195,921 tons, up 26.2 per cent.

A breakdown of freight loadings by commodity groups, shows increased tonnages in five of the six categories. Products of agriculture rose 38.8 per cent to 2,617,343 tons; animals and products increased 24.7 per cent to 71,266 tons; forest products gained 19.3 per cent to 1,473,486 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous were up 15.9 per cent to 3,785,291 tons and mines and products rose 8.9 per cent to 8,701,164 tons. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) fell 7.6 per cent to 81,452 tons.

On an area basis, all provinces with the exception of Prince Edward Island reported increased freight loadings during the month under review. Alberta tonnages were up 40.4 per cent; New Brunswick 34.0 per cent; Saskatchewan 33.1 per cent; Ontario 17.8 per cent; British Columbia 13.8 per cent; Manitoba 13.6 per cent; Quebec 6.5 per cent; Newfoundland 4.9 per cent and Nova Scotia 3.9 per cent. Prince Edward Island freight loadings dropped 9.4 per cent.

Revenue freight terminating on railway lines in Canada during the current month totalled 18,583,360 tons, a gain of 15.6 per cent over September 1963. Of the 1964 month total, 15,777,159 tons were unloaded at points in Canada (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,806,201 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 13,714,118 tons terminating in Canada and 2,357,634 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections during the same month of 1963.

During the first three quarters of 1964 a total of 147,919,166 tons of revenue freight was loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 19.3 per cent over the like period of 1963.
