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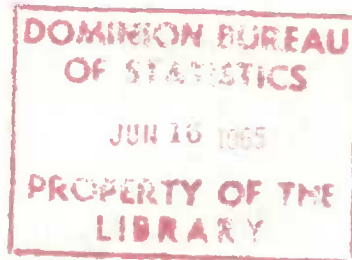

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RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

JANUARY 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-three class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (the C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Excluded from this report are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all common carrier rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During January 1965, a total of 13,351,696 tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, down 3.4 per cent from January 1964. Of the current month total, 11,355,517 tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water carriers), a decrease of 3.7 per cent from the previous year and overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 4.8 per cent to 1,204,199 tons. Revenue freight received from U.S. rail connections destined to points in Canada rose 3.3 per cent to 791,980 tons.

Revenue freight loadings decreased in three of the six major commodity groups. Products of agriculture, which reflected heavy export wheat movements in the previous year, fell 38.9 per cent to 1,551,090 tons; less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) declined 11.0 per cent to 53,919 tons and forest products decreased 1.4 per cent to 1,240,743 tons. Products of mines increased 10.1 per cent to 4,651,362 tons; animals and products rose 6.5 per cent to 69,653 tons and manufactures and miscellaneous were up 4.1 per cent to 3,788,750 tons.

On a geographic basis, five of the ten provinces reported decreased loadings during January 1965. Tonnages loaded fell 34.5 per cent in Saskatchewan; 25.6 per cent in Alberta; 7.4 per cent in British Columbia; 4.0 per cent in Manitoba and 3.7 per cent in Prince Edward Island. Loadings increased 14.4 per cent in Quebec; 9.3 per cent in New Brunswick; 5.8 per cent in Newfoundland; 2.0 per cent in Nova Scotia and 1.7 per cent in Ontario.

Freight terminated on railway lines in Canada during January 1965, totalled 13,223,822 tons, down 4.0 per cent from the same month a year ago. Of the 1965 month total, 10,365,981 tons were unloaded at Canadian points (including deliveries to water carriers) and 2,857,841 tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 10,835,153 tons terminated in Canada and 2,939,280 tons delivered to U.S. rail connections in January 1964.
