

RAILWAY FREIGHT TRAFFIC

OCTOBER 1965

Presented in this report are revenue freight traffic statistics of twenty-five (twenty-three in 1964) class 1 and 2 railways operating in Canada, (The C.N.R., C.P.R. and other carriers having average gross revenues of \$500,000 or more annually). Included in the 1965 data are the Wabush Lake Railway and Arnaud Railway (in Newfoundland and Quebec, respectively) both of which were not in operation during the earlier year. Excluded are details of class 3 and 4 roads (companies with annual revenues of less than \$500,000) whose traffic represents about one per cent of all rail movements. Freight interchanged between Canadian railways is not duplicated in this publication.

During October, 19.4 million tons of revenue freight were loaded in Canada and received from United States rail connections, up 5.0 per cent from October 1964. Of the 1965 figure, 17.4 million tons were loaded in Canada (including receipts from water lines), an increase of 5.7 per cent over the previous year period. Rail freight received from U.S. rail for delivery in Canada, at 0.9 million tons rose 12.5 per cent, while overhead freight (U.S. to U.S. through Canada) declined 9.0 per cent to 1.1 million tons.

Rail loadings in Canada registered increases in three of the six major commodity groups. Less-than-carload freight (l.c.l.) rose 81.5 per cent to 149,451 tons; manufactures and miscellaneous increased 9.9 per cent to 4,213,764 tons and products of mines were up 7.2 per cent to 8,699,861 tons. In the latter category iron ore loadings increased 416,632 tons. Animals and products were down 3.7 per cent to 75,696 tons; products of agriculture decreased 2.3 per cent to 2,911,180 tons and products of forests declined 1.6 per cent to 1,346,368 tons.

On a geographic basis, increased loadings were reported in six of the ten provinces. Newfoundland rail movements more than tripled those of the previous year, due mainly to the addition of Wabush Railway Statistics. Saskatchewan movements rose 13.5 per cent; Nova Scotia 7.8 per cent; British Columbia 7.4 per cent; Ontario 6.7 per cent and Manitoba 1.2 per cent. Loadings in New Brunswick were down 5.2 per cent; Alberta 2.3 per cent; Prince Edward Island 1.7 per cent and Quebec 1.3 per cent.

During the month under review, revenue freight terminated by rail in Canada amounted to 19.4 million tons, an increase of 5.9 per cent over the 1964 month. Of the October 1965 total, 16.5 million tons were unloaded in Canada (including deliveries to water lines) and 2.8 million tons were delivered to U.S. rail connections. This compares with 15.5 million tons terminated in Canada and 2.8 million tons delivered to U.S. rail connections one year earlier.

During the first ten months of 1965 a total of 169.0 million tons of revenue freight was loaded on railway lines in Canada and received from U.S. rail connections, up 1.6 per cent from the corresponding period of 1964.
